



Uniform Policy

Stage Three and Four (Year 3 – Year 6)

Unisex Sports Uniform

The following items are compulsory school issue only.

- Shorts or track pants
- Polo shirt
- Rugby top
- White socks
- Hat

The following items are not school issue

- Sport Shoes – predominately white, black or grey cross trainers/joggers, with same colour laces or velcro.

Interpretations: 'Predominantly' implies that the majority of the shoe, including the main body of the shoe, is one of the three approved colours.

'Cross trainers / joggers' does not include basketball boots, leisure or street shoes

Girls Winter Uniform

The following items are compulsory school issue only.

- Skirt or slacks/shorts
- Shirt
- Jumper
- Navy socks
- Navy tights (optional)

Optional school issue

- Tie

The following items are not school issue

- Shoes – plain black 'leather style' lace up or plain black 'Mary Jane' style.

Note: Winter dress is worn in term 2 and 3. Summer dress is worn in terms 1 and 4. During May and September, either uniform is permitted.

Girls Summer Uniform

The following items are compulsory school issue only.

- Dress or (shorts/slacks and shirt)
- Jumper
- Navy socks
- Hat

The following items are not school issue

- Shoes – Plain black 'leather style' lace up or plain black 'Mary Jane' style.

Note: Winter dress is worn in term 2 and 3. Summer dress is worn in terms 1 and 4. During May and September, either uniform is permitted.



Boys Summer and Winter Uniform

The following items are compulsory school issue only.

- Trousers or shorts
- Shirt
- Jumper
- Grey socks
- Hat

Optional school issue

- Tie

The following items are not school issue

- Shoes - Plain black 'leather style' lace up

Additional Requirements / Options

Compulsory school issue additional items

- School bag

Optional school issue accessories

- Hair accessories in school colours
- Navy blue scarf
- Art smock

Optional accessories permitted

- Medic alert bracelet
- Wrist watch
- Small silver or gold plain sleepers or studs (One per earlobe. No other piercings permitted)
- Plain navy blue or white hair accessories (eg ribbons, headbands, clips, ties)
- Plain navy blue jacket over rugby top / jumper on days of extreme or inclement weather
- Art smock

Not permitted

- Items of uniform that replace any of the above 'compulsory school issue only' items
- Make up
- Nail polish
- Tattoos

Hairstyles

- Neatly cut and styled so as not to draw unnecessary attention to the student - including hair colour not significantly changed from natural colouring.
- Long hair is to be tied back away from the face.
- Short hair should not be less than a 'Number 3' over the top.

Sport Uniform

Sport Uniform is worn on the day that Physical Education is scheduled, or when indicated by the school that Sport Uniform is better suited to a scheduled activity.

Hat

A hat is required to be worn whenever students are involved in school activities held outside during the months of August to May. Students not wearing a hat during these months will be directed to a designated shade area.

During the months of June and July, the wearing of a hat when spending time outside for a relatively short period of time, eg. recess, lunch, most sport lessons, will be optional. However, a hat may be required for lengthy periods spent outdoors.

Second Hand Uniform

A range of second-hand items are available for sale through the Uniform Shop dependent on supply. Parents are invited to present clean second-hand uniforms that are in very good condition for resale on consignment through the Uniform Shop. The items are priced by the Uniform Shop Manager and displayed for sale. Following the sale, 80% of the sale price is passed on to parents. Sale of second hand items does not include superseded items or styles.

Implementation Responsibilities

Parents are to ensure that students have the correct uniform and wear it at all times. If there is a reason why the correct uniform cannot be worn in the short term, parents are to inform the school with a reason.

If the school identifies uniform to be incorrect, parents are informed using an approved notification process, and it is expected that issues will be rectified as directed.
